



Physicist Lucille Streets is evaluating aircraft oxygen regulators at the National Bureau of Standards in 1949. The regulators supplied an oxygen-air mixture in response to a pilot's inhalation, and automatically adjusted the proportion of the gas mixture with changes in altitude. The evaluation equipment included a low pressure chamber, an altimeter, a flowmeter, and a magnetic oxygen concentration meter.
