



Stephanie Siegel of the National Bureau of Standards' (NBS) Center for Computer Sciences using the NBS-developed MAGIC (Machine for Automatic Graphics Interface to a Computer) in 1967. MAGIC could read and store diagrams drawn on its screen with a light pen. Siegel was using MAGIC to encode Chinese language characters for computer storage and processing, with the ultimate goal of direct machine reading of Chinese text.
